### Designing Pedestrian Facilities for Accessibility (DPFA)

#### 2-Day Training Workshop

**Dates:** July 9 & 10, 2014 [8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.]

**Location:** Newark Campus, University of Delaware

**Workshop Overview:**

This two-day course was developed by the Federal Highway Administration to provide a more in-depth understanding of the needs of those with various physical disabilities and the design elements necessary to meet those needs, particularly in relation to the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

**Content Overview:**

The course's eight modules cover the following areas common to the various ADA Guidelines.

Laws, Regulations, and Characteristics	Pedestrian Crossings
Pedestrian Access Route	Accessible Pedestrian Signals
Curb Ramps and Other Transitions	Street Furniture and Parking
Detectable Warning Devices	Work Zones and Maintenance

The course will navigate the various design requirements and introduce creative solutions to some typical alteration challenges. It will also discuss the current state of various ADA accessibility guides, the FHWA guidance on use of the draft Public Right of Way Accessibility Guidelines (PROWAG) and last June's USDOJ-FHWA directive on alterations.
