I. CALL TO ORDER & WELCOME

The meeting was called to order at 6:04pm.

II. GUEST SPEAKER – TOBIAS LEMKE (CIRTL & CTAL)

- CIRTL: Center for the Integration of Research, Teaching, and Learning (cirtl-info@udel.edu)
 - International network of research universities for pedagogy improvement. Graduate students oftentimes have little to no instruction on teaching methods.
 - CIRTL's core values: teaching-as-research, learning community, learning-through-diversity.
 - Open to graduate students and postdocs. CIRTL will provide pedagogical training via online courses and workshops free of charge. This will help students be better teachers, improve CVs, and build a learning community within UD.

- CTAL: Center for Teaching and the Assessment of Learning (CTAL-info@udel.edu)
 - Services for graduate teaching assistants: consultations, observations, workshops and conversations (Context and feedback, Nov. 4th; Grading fairly and effectively, Dec 2nd; Hot topics in the classroom, Nov 1st).
 - Zero-credit courses: UNIV 601 (Fall) Pedagogy; UNIV 600 (Spring) Learning.
 During the course, you will finish a deliverable on your teaching philosophy.
 - Various sessions are available that are coming up in winter/summer break.

 job market seems more favorable for research-stellar candidates even with no
 emphasis or experience in teaching.

The job-market is changing to favor well-rounded candidates. Also, it is fairly easy to elevate your level of teaching compared to elevating your research. Why not invest?

- B. Proposal for resolution: Battery recycling program
 - a. Single-stream recycling led to closure of various recycling centers. Things such as batteries, electronics, or Styrofoam are not always easily recyclable. EHS has the

- ability to recycle them, but the system does not exist, nor do many people know about it. We are trying to install boxes with EHS number stickers to recycle more things on campus.
- Comment: The biohazards container is not available for use for battery collection.
 A: This is a pilot program, so if this moves forward with EHS we can get designated containers.
- C. Proposal for resolution: Speakeasy closure
 - a. Resolution to bring back the Speakeasy at the same location. Soliciting ideas and opinions.
 - b. The graduate office is notified of this issue, but the solution is not clear. Hence the resolution can be focused on emphasizing the importance of a social space for graduate students to gather.
 - c. Some faculty members were also disappointed of Speakeasy closure. If a petition is created, we would also be able to gain faculty support.
 - d. Question: will there be an alternative to Speakeasy? A: not found one yet.
 - e. Please contact Julie Steinberg (julies@udel.edu) if interested in participating.
- D. Upcoming issues: Introduction of graduate student contract mandatory vacation time
 - a. Student life committee is discussing this issue at committee meetings. Soliciting anecdotes and ideas. Faculty Senate meeting has been also working on this, there will be an eventual invitation for student representatives.
