I. CALL TO ORDER & WELCOME

The meeting was called to order at 6:07 pm.

II. GUEST SPEAKERS: ERIC GAO-SPEAKING ON THE GRADUATE RESEARCH FORUM

- How past GSG committee plan Graduate research forum 2017:
 - o Forum serves as a platform for graduate students to present their research.
 - o One of the major objectives is to get the students to submit their research abstract. Once the abstract is received, it is then reviewed and classified as per different interests/panels.
 - o Struggle
 - To get students submit their abstract. It is not only limited to traditional research but also business students can submit their research abstract. Thus, the forum will get diverse representation.
 - To get an audience. This is important for both speakers and audience. As audience can learn from speaker's research and speakers will get feedback.
 - o There is a registration fee. However, this should not be set-back for students. Since students can register for volunteer and get the fee waived off
 - o Invite guest speakers.
 - o Benefits of participating in the forum:
 - As an organizing chair, it helps improve communication skills and other soft skills. It gives a platform to develop leadership skills.
 - As a moderator the research forum mimics actual national conference.
 Thus being moderators give you the experience of how actual conference and session work.
 - o 2017 research forum had showcase 3-D printer.
 - o Recommendation for having a successful forum:
 - Being sincere as working on forum involves working with deadline.
 - Core team who can dedicate a considerable amount of time.
 - Not everyone shows up so there might be wastage of food. So the key point is to get as much graduate students as possible.
 - o In 2017 research forum, speaker had an option of selecting the time for presentation, i.e., either long (15 mins) or short (5-10 mins) presentation
- 2018 Graduate Research forum Ideas:
 - o 2018 research forum will have students from other universities mostly from Philly and Wilmington to present their research.
 - o As part of building bridges theme, 2018 research forum will have community members e.g. people from Dupont will come and talk about their expertise.
 - o 2018 research forum will have the various research theme, e.g., applied medical technology set up so students can submit their abstract for the specific theme that they feel is most apt.

- o Timing will be dependent on the amount of abstract submitted. Approximately, 10-20 minutes.
- o There will be multiple concurrent sessions.
- o Participation is welcome to undergraduate students. However, they cannot submit their research.
- o There will be awards for best speaker/research in the graduate research forum.
- o IDEAS
 - This year, there will be session Pitch 90 where speakers will have 90 seconds to pitch their research. The benefit for this session Get to the point faster, thus the goal of this session allows the graduate students communicate with their research to community and lay people.
 - The suggestion of having a thematic poster session, which involves a combination of poster and podium presentation.

 - o Invite new professors, so they know what kind of research is going on in UD
 - o Usually, the research presentation will fall into following categories:
 - Podium
 - Poster
 - Art presentation present music/art
