



Delaware 4-H State Indoor Archery Championship Format

- All Divisions will shoot 30 scored arrows
- Shooters will begin the session with 2 practice ends
 - Time limit of 2 minutes on each practice end
 - Archers can shoot as many as they desire within this time
- Once the “Practice” ends have been completed they will shoot 10 scored ends of 3 arrows each
- Archers are given up to 2 minutes to shoot their 3 arrows
- The Highest Possible score is 330
- Scoring is the same for all Divisions & Classes
- When scoring, if the shaft touches the line it scores the higher value
- All scoring will be completed by the Archers as Grouped with the targets
- Scoring will be done with a Paper Scorecard and an Electronic Tablet
- The Paper Scorecard is the OFFICIAL SCORECARD
- If the scoring group has a judgement question and cannot agree on an arrow value they will ask one of the Range Officials for assistance
- Scorecards and Tablets will remain downrange at all times
- Scores will be live online and parents can follow along online
- Coaching of the athletes is not permitted
- Archers will be in the “Athlete Zone” and only Athlete's and Official's are permitted within this area while they are competing

Tie breaking procedure

Ties will be broken by the highest number of 11's, if this does not break the tie, you then move down to the 10's, 9's, 8's, etc.

If this does not allow for a winner - it will result in a tie.

***Note** - Archers can elect to use a 3-spot 40 cm FITA Triangle format. This is a typical choice with advanced compound archers.
