Study Program: Urban Revitalization and Historic Preservation in Poland *March 20-30, 2013*



Poland presents an interesting case study for historic preservation and urban place-making. Not only Poland's history, but the idea of what makes it a nation, is reflected in its built environment. Poland has constantly been trying to maintain a balance between occupation and devastation and its own right to existence due to its divisive history during its partitions, World War II, and the Cold War. Influences from Russian, Prussian, Ottoman, Austrian, German, and Soviet occupations intermingle, but the distinctly Polish belief system is predominant in its urban landscape today.
