### III. Committee updates (standing, undergrad, Bylaws)

- a. Ad-hoc Bylaws Committee
  - i. The ad-hoc Bylaws Committee met during the week of 2/25.
  - ii. They had the task of editing the current Bylaws
  - During the meeting, one section concerning committees was amended. They proposed the following amendment to the SAPA Blyaws, Committee subsection:

### 5.3 Standing Committees.

5.3.1 The following committees must have three (3) active members each year:

- Professional Development Committee;
- Social Committee;
- Community Service Committee; and

b. Undergraduate Committee

- i. At the meeting undergraduate committee representatives stated that SPPA needs more undergraduate representation.
- ii. Current SAPA Officers were encouraged to visit undergraduate classes and inform them about SAPA (what we do, who we are, etc...). SPPA Officers were also asked to tap into undergraduate organizations and forge lasting relationships with predominately undergraduate associations on campus.
- iii. Undergraduate committee representatives also discussed one of UD's Philanthropic endeavors, <u>UDance</u>.
  - UDance is a 12-hour philanthropic dance marathon that unifies the campus community and raises awareness about pediatric cancer. It's the university's largest student-run philanthropy and has donated over \$900,000 in 6 years of existence. This past year alone we doubled 5 years of effort by raising over \$450,000. These donations have benefited <u>The</u> <u>Andrew McDonough B+ Foundation</u>, which supports medical research for families of critically ill children across the country.
  - Although it was short notice to fully participate, representatives told current SAPA Officers to think about participating in the event next year and support a B+ child.
- iv. During the April SAPA General Meeting, undergraduate committee leaders will inform the SPPA student body about updates from their undergraduate March Meeting.
