1882 Record of the Moses Gunn Family

The attached letter came to light when my mother (Eunice Mae Knauff Gehrlein) asked her Aunt Hazel Griggs Sevison in the early 1990's about any recollections that she had of their ancestors. Her Aunt Hazel produced this letter dated January 1, 1882 that had recorded the names and dates of birth for Gunn Family descendants of Moses Gunn. There is no information regarding who wrote it, or why they wrote it, but it was obviously connected in some way to Eunice Gunn Cornell; who was the grand-daughter of Aaron D. Gunn and the great-grandmother of my mother. The list from Charles through Hiram definitely appear to be the children of Moses Gunn. It is difficult to determine if the one name is "David" or "Daniel", but the family had a habit of reusing the names of sons from generation to generation, and the name David never appeared anywhere else. It is known from records of Aaron D Gunn's property settlement when he died intestate in Alden, NY in 1833 that he had brothers named Daniel and Hiram. Aaron D. Gunn married Philinda Stratton in Shaftsbury, VT in 1813. Aaron and Philinda had their oldest son Spencer Clay Gunn in 1816, and there are a number of sources that state that Spencer was born in Vermont (Eunice Gunn Cornell was the daughter of Spencer and Sarah Jenks Gunn). Brothers Aaron and Daniel Gunn then jointly purchased property from the Holland Land Company in Darien, Genesee County, NY in 1817.

Further research strongly suggests that the names on the list that follow Hiram Gunn are the children of Charles Gunn. The wording in the last paragraph suggests that this letter was written by one of the children of Charles Gunn, Jr.
