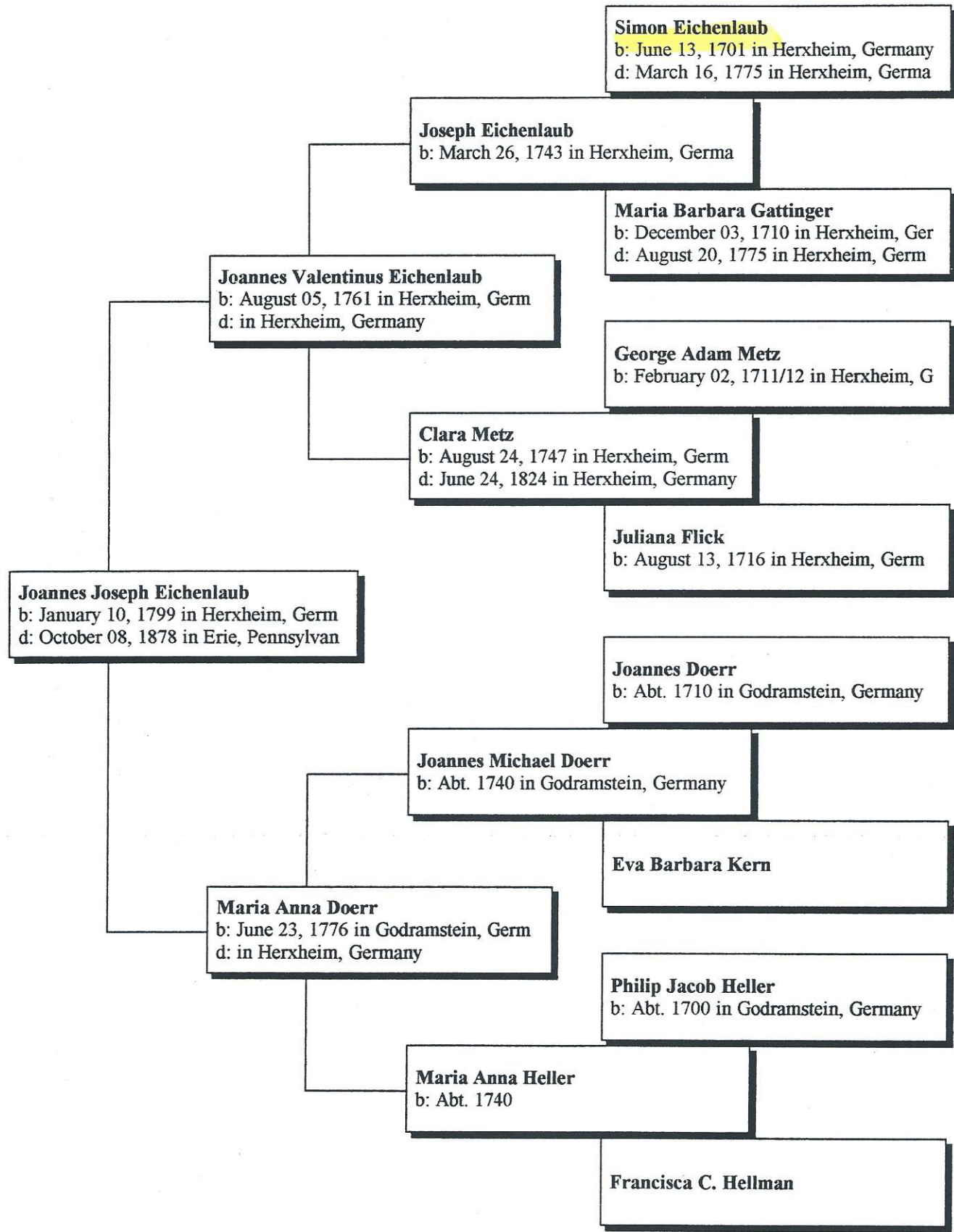


Ancestors of Johann Joseph Eichenlaub

Johann Joseph Eichenlaub was determined to be the German immigrant who settled in Erie, PA with his wife Margaretha in Chapter VI of the 1993 Gehrlein Family History. The extended family tree that tracks the Eichenlaub Family name from Heinrich Eichenlaub to Johann Joseph Eichenlaub was developed by Audry Mascharka, and it is presented in the section Descendants of Heinrich Eichenlaub. Notes for JOANNES JOSEPH EICHENLAUB:

Arrived in the Port of New Orleans on December 24, 1846. He went first to Cincinnati and then to Erie where he finally settled. Started a grocery business at 26th and Peach Streets and ran it successfully for 30 years.

Opened a hotel opposite the grocery but it was not a success and he had to give it up. Had some real estate dealings and owned property by St. John's Church where his daughter, Elizabeth lived. He was one of the

founders of St. Mary's Church.

OBIT -Oct. 8, 1878 - Death of Mr. Joseph Eichenlaub, Sr.

The community was surprized and shocked yesterday morning upon hearing of the death of Mr. Joseph Eichenlaub, Sr., who quietly passed away at ten o'clock Tuesday morning at his residence, corner of Twenty-sixth and State Streets, after a painful illness of about a week, resulting from a constitutional disease which had been preying upon his vitals for eighteen years.

Mr. Eichenlaub was born in Herxheim, Landau county, Bavaria, in 1799, and was therefore nearly eighty years of age. He came to America in 1846, and settled at Cincinnati, in which city his two brothers had located some years previous. After a short residence there, Mr. E. visited Erie, and was so impressed with the natural advantages of the then embryo city that he concluded to make it his home. He immediately commenced business at the corner of Twenty-sixth and Peach Streets, where to-day is located the grocery house of Mr. Valentine Schultz. After thirty years of successful business, he opened the hotel directly opposite, now known as the "Lowry property". His active and business like nature soon convinced him however that this last enterprize was not his calling and he again entered into the commercial trade, by which he amassed wealth rapidly. Many of the leading enterprises of those days received fresh impetus from his liberal hand. He was one of the founder's of St. Mary's Catholic Church, on East Ninth Street, but at his death was a devout member of St. John's Church, on Twenty-sixth Street. He was a man of the strictest integrity, and was universally affable and kindly to all with whom he came in contact. For the last fifteen years he had been out of active business and had during the time used his influence and capital in assisting his sons in business. His wife and a family of six grown children survive him. They are Messrs. Joseph, Jr., J. A., Ferdinand, and Frank Eichenlaub; the daughters are Mrs. Philip Schlindwein, Mrs. J. C. Duerner, and Mrs. Mentz. Mr. Eichenlaub was attended in his dying moments by his pastor, Rev. Father Decker, who administered the last sacrament, and his physician, Dr. Brandes.
