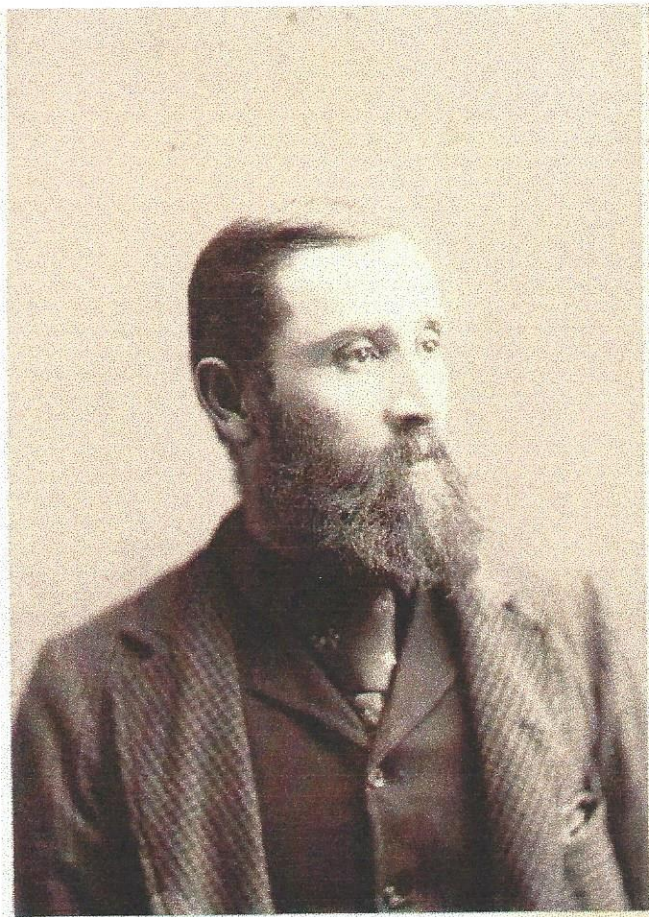


Henry Charles Duerner

Henry Duerner is mentioned on Page 50 of the 1993 Gehrlein Family Genealogy as a brother of Joseph Christoph Duerner. Very little was known about Henry except for an obituary reference from the death of J. C. Duerner that this brother had moved to “Dakota”. As things turned out, this was true. Cara Duerner Broich, the great granddaughter of Henry Charles Duerner developed a complete history of this branch of the Duerner Family.
