FOREWORD TO GENEALOGIES

In this section I have tried to include all available records of Colrain families whose ancestors first arrived in the town before 1800, using the Census of 1790 and 1800 as a guide. A few were only "passing through," as it were, leaving no impression on the town, and those I have omitted. Others who gave valuable service to the town and whose descendants are perhaps living here or nearby, but who came after 1800 I have also regretfully been obliged to omit, for lack of space and time. In many cases the lack will be partly compensated in the biographies.

Although I have checked and rechecked, errors will be found, especially in dates. As every genealogist knows, there are frequent discrepancies between town and church records, and between either of these and family records. Family records are usually more reliable, but often entries in family Bibles are made after a considerable lapse of time and to the best (and sometimes faulty) recollection of the person who records the event. Add to this the possibility of human error in making copies and of long-ago human vanity in reporting ages to a census-taker, and you will see that accuracy is hard to achieve. Too, early genealogists sometimes record surmise as fact.

In most cases I have confined family histories to three or four generations for space-saving reasons, and because I feel that recent records are easier to find than early ones. Also, I have not usually followed a family for more than one generation after its members left Colrain unless the removal was to a nearby town. I have omitted specifying the name of the state in the case of Massachusetts towns and in the case of Halifax, Vermont which adjoins Colrain to the northeast. As with Heath and Shelburne, people often lived in Colrain and traded in Halifax or vice versa, and a son might buy land next to his father's but over the town (or state) line. In fact the line between Massachusetts and Vermont has been redrawn at least twice in the neighborhood of Colrain. Early residents of the Gore lived in what was variously known as Falltown, Bernardston and Leyden until the year 1779, when the Gore was annexed to Colrain.

This section was begun in 1938 at the same time as the History, and much information was obtained from my grandfather's notes and correspondence, from friendly Colrain residents and descendants, from family genealogies, and from that invaluable book, THE BIOGRAPHICAL REVIEW OF FRANKLIN COUNTY. When I was obliged to lay the work aside the genealogical research was carried on, mostly by correspondence, by my father, the late Hugh H. McClellan, with most valuable assistance from Marion Sisler and Ruby Austin. These three not only secured records but by careful reasoning and analysis contrived to fit the pieces of many a puzzle into a recognizable picture of the family in question. Again, my job has mostly been that of editor.

His wife was Rebecca (Fisher), b. abt. 1751; d. Colrain May 3, 1838, a. 87. He came from England, and had a brother Benjamin, unm. who lived briefly in Colrain. Although there is no record of their owning land in the town or holding public office, the family lived there for more than 80 years.
