History of the Town of Paris, Maine

The appended pages are taken from *History of the Town of Paris, Maine from its Settlement to 1880*, by William B. Lapham and Silas P. Maxim, printed by the authors, Paris, ME, 1884. Biographies of families in Paris, Maine are presented, and several members of the Maxim Family are included. An entry is included for Samuel Maxim of Massachusetts on Page 673, and it presents the same list of children for Samuel and Hannah Maxim that is written in *History of the Town of Wayne, Kennebec County, Maine: From its Settlement to 1898*, by George W. Walton:

The biography goes on to provide significant additional detail about the descendants of Samuel Maxim, Jr. and his son Nathan, who was the ancestor that led to the Maxim Family in Maine. Two of Nathan's descendants were the authors of the book.

Our primary interest is that this reinforces the fact that Edmund Maxim was the son of Samuel and Hannah Maxim of Rochester, MA and that he was related to the branch of the family that relocated to Maine. However, Edmund remained in Massachusetts.

SHAS MAXIM, son of Nathan, came to Paris in 1788, and purchased the lot of David Sanger (taking a bond for a deed), where he remained through life. This is one of the few homesteads that have remained in the possession of the family. He m. Hannah, dan of Ichahod and Hannah (Rogers) Waterman of Kingston, Mass., Sept. 3, 1795. Their names appear first on the record of publishments after the organization of the town. Children:
